It is now possible to check your account balances and recent transactions via text messages. Once you have completed enrollment on the Mobile Banking section of the Options tab on Internet Banking, you can text "bal" to 89549 and the balances on your enrolled accounts will be sent to you almost instantly via text message. If you include one of the account nicknames chosen at enrollment, you will receive just the balance on that account. Similarly, you can send "hist" and receive your recent transaction history.

http://pgbk.mobi allows you to access account information and make transactions from your phone's web browser. Optimized for mobile use, pgbk.mobi provides fast, free, and secure access to your accounts. Paragon Mobile Web allows you to not only see account balances and recent transactions for enrolled accounts, but also to transfer money between your Paragon accounts and pay bills to your previously established payees. To enroll, sign into internet banking, click on Options, then Mobile Banking.

Coming this spring, Paragon Mobile App will be available. Paragon Mobile App will be an application made specifically for iPhone users. This app will give you fast and free access to account information by using your phone's built-in functions. Upon completion, TransFirst will reduce your quarterly PCI fee to \$18.80.

Gift Card Survival Guide

Did you receive a gift card over the holidays? Have you ever received a card and forgotten where you put it? Tower Group, a research and advisory services firm focused on the financial services industry, estimates that in one year \$5 billion in gift card value was lost due to misplacement and expiration dates. Here are some tips to help you avoid losing the value of gift cards:

- Put all of your cards in one place
- Make copies of the fronts and backs of your cards and keep them in a place separate from the actual cards so you can cancel them if you misplace them.
- Know when your cards expire. New rules enacted in August of 2010 prohibit gift cards from expiring less than 5 years from the activation date.
- Setup reminders. Establish monthly email alerts to remind yourself to use your gift cards.
- Swap a card that you are unlikely to use at card swapping sites like giftcardrescue.com or swapgift.com.
- Re-gift your unused cards with minor balances to giftcardgiver.com, a non-profit that takes such donations and combines them into higher value cards and distributes them to the needy.
